The AIB Community €1 Million Fund is an annual initiative that supports local charities across Ireland, Northern Ireland, and Great Britain. Here are some frequently asked questions about the Fund:

1. What is the AIB Community €1 Million Fund?

- AIB first launched the Fund in 2022 which supports over 70 local charities nominated by customers, the public, and employees each year.

2. Who can nominate a charity for the fund?

- Anyone, including AIB customers, employees, and the general public, can nominate a registered charity.

3. How do I nominate a charity?

- Visit aibni.co.uk/community or aibgb.co.uk/community and complete the online nomination form.

4. What information is required to nominate a charity?

- Your name, email address, the charity's name, its registration number, the region it's based in, and a brief reason for your nomination.

6. Which regions are eligible for nominations?

- Connacht, Munster, Ulster (ROI), Leinster, Greater Dublin, and Northern Ireland & Great Britain.

7. What are the funding amounts awarded?

- Successful public-nominated charities will receive £15,000
- A once off €10,000 amount for each region (£10,000 in Northern Ireland and Great Britain region) in the public-nominated fund (more details in No.8 below)
- Successful employee-nominated charities receive £5,000
- Charities can be nominated in both funds

8. What is new for 2026?

- In 2026, we are adding an extra once off €60,000 to the AIB Community €1 Million Fund to celebrate Allied Irish Banks, plc 60th anniversary. This will provide an additional €10,000 per region (£10,000 in Northern Ireland and Great Britain region) for the public-nominated charities, enabling us to support even more local projects and initiatives in our communities.

9. Are there restrictions on which charities can be nominated?

- Yes, charities that received funding in the previous three years are ineligible for nomination.

10. Can I nominate more than one charity?

- No, only one nomination per individual and associated email address is accepted.

11. What types of projects are excluded from funding?

- Projects related to religious or political activities, non-charitable activities, animal charities where animals are the primary beneficiaries, and those covering core costs like rent or salaries. 12. How are the nominated charities selected for funding?

- The top seven nominated charities in each region are shortlisted in the public fund and invited to present to a reviewing panel. In 2026, the eighth highest nominated charity in each region will also be shortlisted for the once off amount of €10,000 (£10,000 in Northern Ireland and Great Britain region) and invited to present to a reviewing panel.

13. When do nominations open and close?

- In 2026, nominations will open on Friday 08 May and close on Friday 19 June at 5pm.

14. Can I edit or withdraw a nomination after submitting?

- Nominations are final once submitted.

15. What happens if the charity details (e.g. registration number) are entered incorrectly?

- The nomination will not be counted.

16. How are the funds allocated across regions?

- Each of the six regions are allocated an equivalent amount.

17. Can charities apply directly for funding?

- No, charities must be nominated by individuals; they cannot apply directly.

18. Are there any reporting requirements for funded charities?

- Yes, all nominated charities are subject to due diligence review, and AIB reserves the right to monitor beneficiaries' use of funds.

19. Can a charity be nominated multiple times by different individuals?

- Yes, multiple nominations can increase a charity's chances of being shortlisted.

20. How are employees involved in the nomination process?

- AIB employees can nominate charities, and €300,000 of the fund is allocated to employee-nominated charities.

21. When are the selected charities announced?

- The top charities in each region are announced in Autumn.

22. Can I nominate a charity outside of Northern Ireland and Great Britain?

- Yes, charities registered in Republic of Ireland are also eligible
